## Nepal Constitution Building Assignment

in 2008 the Himalayan nation of Nepal is drafting a new constitution with the goal of providing the country with a stable democracy that reflects the concept of popular covereignty. This poses a challenge in a nation of great ethnic and social diversity. You will be assigned a special interest group whose concerns you will represent in the Constituent Assembly charged with the responsibility of approving the final constitution.
There are two parts to this assignment, one oral and one written.
Oral Presentation Research the position of your group and their concerns. Compose a constitutional amendment that resolves a major concern of your group (ex. Environmentalists who feel addressing deforestation should be a priority of new government). Introduce yourselves to the class (Constituent Assembly) and explain the perspective of your special interest group. Establish the challenge facing Nepal and the constitutional proposal to address the issue. Successful presentations will clearly articulate links between the well being of Nepal as a whole and the resolutions proposed. Be prepared to respond to any questions members of the class may put to you regarding the merits or problems your resolution may cause.
